<b>Scientific name</b>	<b>Common Name</b>	<b>Notes</b>
<b>Aloes</b>		
<i>Aloe elegans</i>	Medicine/Barbados aloe	Clumping species; 3'
<i>Aloe nobilis</i>	Gold tooth aloe	Low clusters 12" high
<b>Annuals</b>		
<i>Achillea millefolium</i>	Yarrow	~1' tall, 1' wide
<i>Coreopsis</i> ssp.	Tickseed	Many varieties; can be up to 4' tall
<i>Escholzia californica</i>	California poppy	Bright orange springtime blooms
<b>Grasses</b>		
<i>Festuca glauca</i>	Clumping blue fescue	~1' tall mounding plant
<b>Salvias</b>		
<i>Salvia coccinea</i>	Coral nymph sage	1-3' tall; 1-3' wide
<i>Salvia elegans</i>	Pineapple sage	3-4' tall; 3-4' wide
<i>Salvia leucantha</i>	Mexican bush sage	3-4' tall; 4-6' wide
<i>Salvia microphylla</i> "hot lips"	Hot lips sage	About 3' tall and 3' wide
<b>Sedums</b>		
<i>Crassula arborescens</i>	Jade plant	1-3' tall; 1-2' wide
<i>Sedum rubrotinctum</i>	Pork and beans	8" branches off low-growing, spreading plant
<i>Senecio serpens</i>	Blue chalk sticks	1' tall; 2-3' wide; water lightly in hot weather
<b>Shrub - Medium</b>		
<i>Callistemon</i>	Dwarf bottlebrush	3' tall; 5' wide
Lantanas	Various - 150 varieties	Can grow up to 6' tall and 8' wide
<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	Rosemary	Can grow up to 5' tall and 3' wide
<i>Senna artemesoides</i>	Feathery cassia	4-6' tall; 4-6' wide
Bird of Paradise		
<b>Shrub - Small</b>		
<i>Lavandula</i>	Lavender	Can grow up to 4-6 feet tall; 4-6 feet wide
<i>Hemerocallis</i>	Day lily	Many varieties; depends
<i>Tulbaghia violacea</i>	Society garlic	1' clumps; flower stalks can reach 2'
<b>Succulents</b>		
<i>Euphorbia tirucalli</i>	Fire sticks	Place in protected area; does not like to freeze; very low water needs
<b>Trees</b>		
<i>Cercis occidentalis</i>	western redbud	Native tall shrub/short tree; likes partial sun/partial shade
<i>Lagerstroemia</i> ssp	Crape myrtle (various)	15 - 30' tall; 15 - 30' wide
